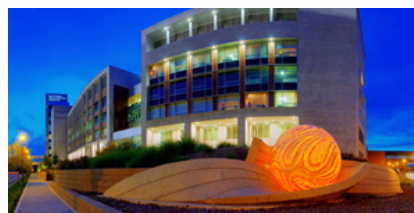

INTERDISCIPLINARY CANCER PREVENTION AND CONTROL TRAINING PROGRAM

Seeking Pre- and Post-Doctoral Applicants beginning Fall 2022
Indiana University-Purdue University (IUPUI)- Indianapolis, Indiana



The primary purpose of this NCI-funded T32 program is to train the next generation of cancer prevention and control scientists to conduct interdisciplinary research spanning the continuum of cancer; prevention, early detection, treatment, and survivorship. Cancer disparities are emphasized throughout the program. This highly interdisciplinary program encourages applications from a broad range of health care disciplines. Past T32 fellows have come from a variety of disciplines including Nursing, Psychology, Public Health, Communications, Medicine, Neuroscience, and Music Therapy. The program is flexible enough to address the educational needs of individuals from different academic home disciplines, but formalized enough to ensure that participants achieve high levels of content knowledge and acquire intensive research experience by the time studies are completed.

PRE-DOCTORAL APPLICANTS

Requirements:

- Candidate must have been accepted into a Ph.D. graduate program at IUPUI or IU-Bloomington and completed their first year of training.
- United States citizen or U.S. permanent resident.

Benefits:

- Maximum of three years of support
- Primary and secondary mentor from different disciplines
- Per-semester stipend
- Student health insurance
- Tuition and fee remission
- Training-related expenses

POST-DOCTORAL APPLICANTS

Requirements:

- A doctoral degree from an accredited school in a discipline relevant to cancer prevention and control.
- A research focus in cancer control consistent with the ongoing work of a primary and secondary mentor.
- United States citizen or U.S. permanent resident.

Benefits:

- Maximum of three years of support
- Primary and secondary mentor from different disciplines
- Monthly stipend
- Student health insurance
- Tuition and fee remission
- Training-related expenses

This training program is housed at the Indiana University School of Nursing on the Indiana University – Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI) campus, in collaboration with the National Cancer Institute-designated Indiana University Melvin and Bren Simon Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Her research interests include developing and evaluating behavioral interventions for cancer symptom management. She is also interested in improving health outcomes of family caregivers of adults with cancer.
