The Indiana University Melvin and Bren Simon Comprehensive Cancer Center (IUSCCC) is proud to offer the IUSCCC American Cancer Society Post-Baccalaureate Diversity in Cancer Research Education Program (IADEP), a two-year experience for recent grads planning to pursue doctoral degrees in biomedical science, healthcare, or in population health/public health.

IADEP will prepare you to submit a competitive application to a premier PhD or MD program. Participants receive a personalized professional development plan and hands-on research experience in a cancer center lab.

ELIGIBILITY

- Must have received an undergraduate science degree from an accredited U.S. college or university within 36 months of the program start date
- Must be a member of an underrepresented minority group, individual with a disability and/or an individual from a disadvantaged background
- Must be interested in applying to highly competitive PhD graduate or professional clinical programs related to cancer research, community engagement, and practice
- Must have a GPA of 3.0 or better
- Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident

- \$3,000 annual paid travel expenses
- \$35,000 annual stipend
- \$5,000 annual paid lab supply expenses
