Did You Know?

- Men are often diagnosed with breast cancer at a later stage.
- **Non-Hispanic Black men** have the highest incidence and mortality rates from breast cancer compared to men in other racial and ethnic groups.
- Although the survival rate of **Latino males** with breast cancer at one year is higher than the survival rate of white males, from one to five years that survival rate rapidly falls to more than four percentage points lower than white men.
- Like Asian women, **Asian men** are less likely to know and understand that they can develop breast cancer.
