How Advocates Can Help the Tissue Bank

- 1. Have a good understanding of what the Komen Tissue Bank is
 - i. Use key talking points provided by the Tissue Bank
 - ii. Visit the website to view what resources are available (tissue bank is expanding the ethnic diversity and age range of samples stay current on updates)
 - iii. Be able to provide Tissue Bank contact information to researchers (many unaware there is a biorepository of just healthy tissue)
- 2. Share information with researchers
 - i. Those they are working with
 - ii. At meetings
 - iii. Others within their communities
- 3. Potential Tissue Collection Event
 - i. Opportunity
 - 1. Tissue Bank is looking to have events in various places across the country
 - 2. Get community more involved in research
 - 3. Help expand the diversity of the tissue samples
 - 4. Bring various stakeholders together for a major event that can impact breast cancer research (stimulates collaboration and awareness)
 - 5. Reduces fear/anxiety of research and perhaps clinical trials

ii. Challenges

- 1. Must secure a medical partner (contract needed) and medical providers as volunteers
- 2. IRB Approval at all stages may lead to delays (must start the process at least a year ahead of the event)
- 3. Barriers to convincing various ethnic groups to participate due to fears of research and clinical trials
